# Llangynidr's Ukrainians raise funds for their homeland dfa

in Powys the couple and their three children y left their Kiev home taking with them only what they could gather in a matter of minutes.

Maryna was brought up in Donetsk, the city founded by John Hughes of Merthyr Tydfil, but the annexation of the Donbas region in 2014, drove her to move to Lviv and finally to Kiev. For this reason the couple's three children were each born in different cities.

In the last year the family have become popular newcomers as they sell hand decorated items at their stall in Abergavenny Market Hall, funds from which go directly to those in need in the Ukraine. Vadym sells freshly squeezed orange juice made to passers-by from his stall outside the Market's main entrance.

The couple are very proud of their Ukrainian heritage and culture – a fact illustrated by the designs on the objects they sell. Maryna does not price individual items but just ask buyers to donate what they think is appropriate. They have been very touched by the response of their host country.

Ladybird Shop held lots of outfit memories for many members and Pinches was remembered for what sounds like mouth-watering pasties!

### The Livestock Market



Lots of you shared memories of the market itself – the sights and sounds, with plenty of you recalling the smell of the slaughterhouse. The vibrancy of the market seems a fond memory for many, and lots of you recall how it really provided a sense of meaning and place to Abergavenny as a market town. Shops and pubs, in particular, were fit to bursting on Market days with farmers enjoying a drink and a game of cards!

Not all memories were fond ones, however, with plenty of you harbouring harrowing memories of market days and the slaughtering of animals.

### Bailey Park

We shared an image of Bailey Park from 1960, which took in a view of the Deri. We read plenty of childhood memories of the scary seesaw as well as a fire that decimated part of the oak woodland in the late fifties. So many of our members were able to identify the year of the photos by observing the absence of some of the current council houses, as well as the type of roofing material used on the pavilion. # Search Excellence award for Damon of Mountain Rescue



he team has been out and about all over our patch since our last article.

The month started with us being called by Dyfed Powys police to reports of an unconscious walker near Pen Gloch y pibwr, as we had our first team making their way up the mountain the Coastguard helicopter was able to get in through the clouds and transport the casualty to the hospital to be looked after.

We then had to call outs to the Hay Bluff area, one near the trig point summit and one further towards Black Hill. The first involved a gentleman who had had a medical episode and needed urgent evacuation from the mountain, which we did by using our stretcher as a sled and sliding him down the front face while on a rope. The second was an experienced winter runner who got into difficulty in the heavy snow. Working with our colleagues

from Hereford Fire and Rescue we were able to locate the runner and walk him carefully off the hill. The team was also contacted by Gwent police to assist with an ongoing search for a high-risk missing person in the Chepstow area. We wish all the casualties a full and speedy recovery.

The big highlight of the month has been quite an honour. Back in December 2021, the team was involved in the search for a missing man in the Abergavenny area. The gentleman in question had been out walking and while taking cover from horrendous weather had had a medical incident. This incident prevented him from calling for help. On the first evening, the team was out from 10 pm till 6 am. The hill members got a few hours sleep while our search managers worked out a plan for day two. At 11 am the team started searching again on the Little Skirrid. After a couple of hours, one of our team

members, on his hands and feet, deep in the overgrowth spotted something that didn't look right, he had found the gentleman. It is hard to explain in words how amazing this find was, Damon followed very subtle clues, used his years of search experience, guidance from his search managers, and his determination to not stop until we had searched everywhere to locate this man. Thankfully he was alive and well, after initial treatment, he was able to be joined by his family. The reason I bring this up is that this month Damon was presented with an award for Search Excellence by the Police Search Governance Board. A senior officer came to our base and presented the award to Damon and we are all incredibly proud of him. What he demonstrated that day is the best of us, the skill of Mountain Rescue and the determination of the Longtown Mountain Rescue Team. Well done, Damon!

### Community Shawl



he Community Shawl is my response to The Red Dress (created by Kirsty MacLeod) which I was very fortunate to have been able to arrange exhibitions and presentations twice in Wales, the most recent in Abergavenny in October 2022.

I have been curating the Shawl project and was joined by Ginevra from The Wool Croft last year, who offered some materials and to help manage the project.

I invited members of the public to join us in creating a fabric square, in any medium, for the creation of the Community Shawl; each square to have an element of red.

My aim was for everyone's work to unite our communities, and the completed Shawl will be then taken to exhibitions and events, celebrating our traditions of tales, community, and friendship.

I am delighted and grateful to have received 120 squares! Each one, intricate and beautiful, tells its own story and is a little symbol of love and connection. They arrange from knitted to embroidered, lace to felted. The residents at Penpergym care home crocheted 50 squares. and they will be the first audience to see the completed Shawl when we visit them.

I have also been invited to take the Shawl to Hereford College of Art and give a talk about the project.

The next stage? To now have each square carefully stitched onto the background material.

We had thought we may purchase some woollen flannel or maybe a vintage shawl for this... but then out of the blue, my mother donated my grandmother's vintage, handmade, woollen nurse's cape! My Nana was for many years, Sister of the wards at Pen Y Fal hospital in Abergavenny, retiring in 1977. Her cape was made by Doreen Rice, in the huge sewing room at the hospital.

I can't think of a better addition to the provenance of this Community shawl, and we are hearing all kinds of wonderful anecdotes from those who remember Pen Y Fal.

We have asked Cheryl at The Wool Croft to stitch the amazing work onto the cape, to transform it into the Shawl. What we would love to do is pay her a fair fee, and we wondered if you would consider donating towards this, please?

# ABERIVILITIEST 2023 CONNOR ALLEN **ALEX WHARTON JUDE ROGERS**

bergavenny's Writing Festival returns on the 21st and 22nd of April to the Kings Arms, the Melville Centre for the Arts and Abergavenny Library. The Abergavenny Writing Festival is about encouraging everyone to write and express themselves, whether for mental health and wellbeing, as a way of making a living, to bring about change, to keep a record or purely for pleasure. This year's **Abergavenny Writing Festival** will be a celebration of writing in all its diverse and creative forms.

Expect talks, discussions, workshops and performances on an eclectic range of topics. 2023 sees the introduction of a "Writers' Hub", where

writers can come together and exchange ideas in a supportive environment. The Society of Authors and the Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators will be present to offer advice and information. In addition there will be some free taster sessions for young people at Abergavenny Library on Saturday 15th April, courtesy of the Abergavenny Rotary Club.

Day one at the Kings Arms will be a day for improving skills and professional advice featuring a poetry workshop with Paul Henry: 'The Singing Page', a talk from The Society of Authors on 'How to Make a Living as a Writer' and Helen Docherty on 'Writing Picture Books for Children.' Hannah Hill will Chair a discussion on Writing and Artificial Intelligence, posing the question: Are our Writing Days Numbered? And Gary Raymond will talk about 'How Welsh Writers Can Help Redefine our Nation.'

On Friday evening there'll be an accessible spoken-word openmic event at The Melville Centre for the Arts. The event will be hybrid so both audience and participants are able to join either in person or via a zoom link.

Saturday 22nd April will see a whole day of events for young people at The Melville, including: Illustration with Max Low, 'Magnificent Mash-Ups' with Children's writer Claire Fayers - a wild and wacky session for seven to twelve year olds. Children's Laureate of Wales, Connor Allen, will offer a poetry session and

later that day there'll be a 'Family Singing Session' with Tanya Walker.

There will be sessions for Welsh speakers, including illustrator and cartoonist Huw Aaron for four to ten year olds (age is for guidance only) and a lunchtime talk and tasting with author and food writer Lowri Haf Cooke.





Germany and Austria, it's traditional to celebrate Easter by hanging hollow eggs from the branches of trees known as Ostereierbaum. It's a custom that has gained popularity in recent years here in the UK, perhaps as a way of marking Easter with an alternative to gorging on chocolate eggs.

If you're interested in blowing and decorating your own eggs – especially if you have kids (good activity for the Easter Hols!) then here's our step by step guide.

- You are best to use room temperature eggs. Chicken eggs are most commonly used, but this method will also work for duck or even tiny quail eggs. Begin by placing a piece of masking tape over each end of the egg
- Poke a small hole through the tape and into the egg at the very top using a thumbtack. Twist the thumbtack carefully

in order to slightly widen the hole

- Repeat this at the other end of the egg, this time making the hole slightly bigger (slightly larger than 0.5cm)
- Insert a straightened out paperclip and give it a good wiggle around in order to break the yolk so that you can blow it out more easily. A toothpick or pin will also do the trick
- 5. Blow through the small hole at the top so that the liquid egg comes out of the larger hole at the bottom. If you have difficulties, shake the egg in order to break up the yolk a little more. Make sure you capture the blown liquid egg in a bowl
- Rinse with water and a dash of vinegar and leave the shells to dry overnight. You can dry them in a low oven to speed up the process. This will help

harden the shells and won't cause them to crack or expand.

Decorate the eggs by dying them (120ml hot water, 1tsp vinegar, 15 drops of food colouring). Leave them submerged for at least 10 minutes or longer according to how deep you'd like the colour to be. You can mask off sections of the egg with polka dot stickers as an example, to prevent the masked area from becoming coloured, and peel them off afterwards.

Use washi tape for an alternative method of decoration. Glitter or temporary tattoos also look attractive, as does puffy paint for a textured effect.

To hang the eggs on an Easter Egg Tree or branch, you will need to use an ornament cap, which are easily found online. Fix them using strong craft glue or a glue gun to hold them in place at the top of the egg. Leave them to dry and get decorating.



Head off along the path that leads into Goytre Hall Wood. If you're doing this walk around mid to late April, there should be a fabulous display of bluebells in the woods. The path bears right to exit the wood. When you leave the wood, follow the track down the hill towards the canal agueduct.

Just before the bridge, turn right up the steep but short path that leads up to the canal. Continue north along the towpath with the canal on your left. There are plenty of attractive narrow boats at the private moorings here.

Cross the canal when you reach the stone bridge and walk through the woods, roughly following the line of the canal. The wood is the site of Gore's Literacy Sculpture trail, so there are lots of interesting and fun things for the kids to see and discover, (look out for the crashed broomstick!) Eventually, you will emerge into the Goytre Wharf car park. Join the road and turn left down the hill.

When you're finished here, head off under the aqueduct and turn left up to the towpath again. This time, though, turn left at the top and follow the towpath south, with the canal on your right.





received some negative feedback recently. I'd been speaking to a group of 100 or so healthcare workers for a couple of hours, about the sorts of things we talk about here—the nature of the human experience; how our understanding of that impacts feelings of stress and wellbeing; the fact that resilience is an unchanging part of who and what we are—and I was intrigued to learn how it had landed for everybody. So I ran an online poll, with four options.

As is usually the case with us humans, responses fell on a normal distribution, or bell-shaped, curve. Towards the middle, on one side, a handful were non-plussed and a bit confused; and in the other direction, the majority of attendees were bowled over - they left the session with a renewed sense of hope, curious to learn more about this understanding.

Delightfully, at one extreme something clicked for someone so deeply that they reported their life had changed, there and then, never to be the same again. (Such is the power of insight.) And then, almost as a mirror, three were comprehensively switched off by it, and felt the content of what I'd shared was actually detrimental to people's wellbeing.

Now... what do you make of that? How can a group all go through exactly the same experience—me. talking on a screen—and vet come away with such radically different impressions?

It's because of the way the mind works, to create our worlds out of this thing we've labelled "thought" You see, none of the participants were experiencing me, they were experiencing their own thought systems—a conglomeration of conditioning, beliefs, memory and mind-projections of meaning and future consequence—all coming to bear in their moment to moment experience of that talk.

Given these were the very facts I'd been pointing to all afternoon, one person happened to really see this, and it all fell away, to reveal the peace, love and wisdom that we all are, all the time, beneath that thought-experience.

Whereas to the three at the other extreme, the same message was perceived by the mind as a threat: harmful, scary, questioning its omnipotence, challenging its very existence!

All are normal, understandable reactions and none are right, or wrong (only a mind deals in that currency). There's simply an invitation here, to look at this, to get curious, to question what you've been told, and the assumptions that have arisen, as a result.

But know this: the mind won't help you on this journey. It can't. It's evolved to protect you from

material harm—to keep your body alive!—and in the absence of physical peril, anything can be perceived as a threat: the words, beliefs or behaviours of another, a memory of an event, an imagined future and yes, even an article like this.

It's your brain's job to create notions of risk, so it can then problem-solve them away, and it will never offer the kind of reassurance you seek. The mind is not your vehicle to happiness, it's the roadblock.

There's nothing you need to do about any of this; no mantras, practices or techniques to apply. As you read, right here and now, take a deep breath and simply observe that you are already safe from harm and that it's only a mind that could suggest otherwise, provoking feelings of danger, as it does so.

Relax into the boundless calm of the present moment. It's something you get to take with you, wherever you go.

Since the 18th-century artists from across the world have been drawn to South Wales. Helen Morgan from Abergavenny Local History Society reports.

■he Valleys became a grand tour honeypot when the Napoleonic Wars put the Continent out of bounds. The explosion of activity and architectural wonders of the industrial revolution inspired painters such as JMW Turner and Julius Caesar Ibbotson to the furnaces in Merthyr Tydfil and Swansea.

By the early 20th century, however, it had fallen out of favour — until a group of students met on the train between the Rhondda and Cardiff College of Art. They spent their daily journey debating art and its meaning, discussing the living European masters, criticism and validation of a common subject the Rhondda. Among them were Charles Burton, Glyn Morgan, Nigel Flower, David Mainwaring, Ernest Zobole and Robert Thomas. This group of talented Welsh artists became known as the Rhondda

Group. Unlike the 18th-century tourists they painted their birthplace, inspired by the tips and terraces, railways and pits, set in a magnificent encircling backdrop of green mountains.

From his late teens to his late 20s, Charles Burton painted his homeland with sincerity and clarity. Aged just 24, he was awarded the Gold Medal in fine art of the National Eisteddfod of Wales for his painting Back from the Club in which simplified figures stroll up the slope, swaying slightly from their hours in the working men's club. Snow in Treherbert, bought by the Arts Council in 1951, which a few years earlier would have flopped, depicts the view over miners' backyards. An exception to the scene was Denys Short from Devon who adopted Wales as his home after winning a Gold Medal at the National Eisteddfod in 1958. His Rhondda Sculptures

staged on the Serpentine Gallery's lawn in London used the front doors and parlour windows of the terrace houses in the mining villages to comment on aspects of life. With some, coal and coal dust overwhelm the house. The aluminium and steel pieces, he said, were a tribute "to housewives who spend their lives attempting to keep their homes bright and spotless."

Nicholas Thornton's talk in the Borough Theatre on April 19th will explore the visual culture of the South Wales coalfield with a particular focus on the collections of Amgueddfa Cymru - Museum Wales. The talk is a free-of-charge ticketed event, starting at 7.30pm, for members of Abergavenny Local History. To join, visit www abergavennylocalhistorysociety.org. uk and download the application form. 


