












Local Councillor Donates Bone Marrow



yle Jamie Eldridge has a feather in his cap, both literally and metaphorically. At the age of 27 Kyle, the Abergavenny Town Councillor for Park Ward, has successfully undergone a procedure to donate bone marrow to a critically ill patient who, thanks to Kyle, now has a chance to live.

You've probably seen Kyle out and about in Abergavenny. He dresses smartly in a snappy suit and trilby hat (with feather!) and a clutch of badges pinned to his lapel. He's not only a councillor, but also the Chair of Gwent Autism Steering Group, he volunteers at both Borough Theatre and the Melville Centre. is a University student, and is a stand-up comedian in training! One thing you won't know about Kyle, however, is that he has exceptionally unique blood.

Kyle has, for the past few years, been an active blood donor for

the Welsh Blood Service, which is how he came to learn about his special blood. As a result, The Welsh Blood Service approached him to ask whether he would be interested in registering as a potential donor for bone marrow and Kyle agreed.

Four months ago, while waiting at Cardiff train station, Kyle received a call from The Welsh Blood Service to inform him that he was needed; he was identified as being a potential bone marrow match - one of four - for a 64-year-old gentleman who was critically ill with an extreme blood disorder in need of a transplant. Lots of paperwork and form filling and tests followed until, thanks to his age, health and quality of blood, it was established that Kyle would be the elected donor.

Kyle says that he didn't really question whether he wanted to do it. His motivation, he says, came from his Christian faith and the chance to potentially save a life. While the donor recipient has been given only a 50/50 chance of survival, Kyle explains that he could not pass up the opportunity to be instrumental in offering hope to a fellow human.

On 30th January this year, Kyle went into the Velindre Cancer Centre in Cardiff after four days of injections (eight overall) beforehand to prepare his blood to ensure it was as healthy as possible. These injections stimulated white blood and

included hormones similar to those given to horses. The side effects were gruelling and unpleasant; headaches, stomach cramps and aching joints to name a few.

Over a period of just over three hours, Kyle donated his bone marrow via stem cell harvesting, which involved a needle being inserted into his arm to remove blood which was placed into a centrifuge to split the cells and plasma, ready for transplanting. The sixty-four-year-old donor recipient would then face a complicated and risky procedure to receive Kyle's bone marrow.

It's a long waiting game. Kyle will not learn whether the recipient of his bone marrow has survived for another six months. In the meantime he plans to recover fully, continue his work in the community, continue giving blood and look ahead to publishing his book and appearing on stage in April when he performs his stand up show!




iving in the Brecon Beacons, Rosie Jarman was a bright, active and beautiful 14 year old girl, with a gift for art, passion for fast cars, acting and the outdoors. In October 2021 she was suddenly and unexpectedly hit with the devastating diagnosis, of an incredibly rare heart tumour which has only ever been found in 35 other people Worldwide, only five of those were children.

Instead of dwelling on the crushing news, Rosie made the decision to 'own' her illness by diligently documenting her cancer journey. Her aim was to support other families in similar situations and help medical professionals learn more about her highly unusual form of the disease.

Throughout a gruelling nine months of treatment including Major Open-Heart Surgery, Chemotherapy and Proton Beam Therapy, Rosie would keep a detailed diary of her treatment. She penned advice and tips for parents and children on what to expect in hospital and what things to take ahead of time, alongside extensive research on a range of childhood cancers.

Rosie wanted to publish her book with the proceeds going to the many incredible charities and organisations who supported her on her journey.

reative Futures swung into full flow in Feb half term with 3 days of immersive theatre sessions. A professional and enthusiastic team of facilitators led a full house of 11 - 19 year olds in building relationship, exchanging ideas and expressing themselves through all manner of fun performance challenges.

"It was something I looked forward to everyday" said Logan (15), one of the participants, "it's so exciting!" Sessions took place in The Melville Theatre and consisted of physical theatre, mask work, improvisation, and a final group performance session. "I've absolutely loved it. I've made friends and I've learnt stuff about myself" - Ross (13)

The workshops helped to build self-esteem through collaboration with others and support from the tutors - "I came in and I felt quite nervous ... but then we talked and communicated. I felt way more confident. I love it here" Rosie (13). Many of the participants had never done drama but everyone was fully immersed and enjoying learning and taking part.

With such a positive response to the initial holiday workshops, a series of term-time sessions kicked off at the end of February, with most places filled in just a few days. Places are full, but you are encouraged to join the waiting list at boroughtheatreabergavenny.co.uk/ creative-futures-monmouthshire/ Places are all free as the project is funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund through Monmouthshire County Council. Through providing low-cost activities and open opportunities, Creative Futures aims to connect with as diverse a range of young people as possible and showcase theatre as a great way to build community and develop real confidence. 





This is one of my favourite store cupboard bakes, so called because I always have the ingredients in the cupboard and can bake it whenever the mood takes me. It can be cooked in an assortment of tins – I usually bake it in a loaf tin so that it can be sliced easily and, if I don't want the temptation of cake lying around, I store it in the freezer so that I can defrost slices of it as and when required.

Ingredients:

- 350ml of strong tea
- 115g mixed fruit
- 86g margarine
- 86g soft brown sugar
- 280g self raising flour
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- 1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda

Method

- Preheat oven 180C/160Fan/ Gas mark 4
- Grease and flour tin
- Boil the tea, fat, sugar and fruit together in a saucepan for 2-3 minutes
- Allow to cool slightly
- Meanwhile sieve the flour, mixed spice and bicarbonate of soda into a mixing bowl

Add the cooled liquid to the flour mixture and beat thoroughly

7 Fill

Fill your prepared tin

Bake in a moderate oven for 30 minutes and then turn down the oven by 20 degrees and bake for a further 30 minutes – a skewer inserted should come out cleanly; if not, bake for a further 5 minutes or until cooked through

Leave to cool – this cake keeps well wrapped in foil.

he veterinary world has undergone some big changes over the last few years. Riverside Vets in Abergavenny and Ebbw Vale would like to share with you how they are adapting to the current economic climate and making big changes to revolutionise how their clients access veterinary care.

Practice owners Helen Rippin RVN and Bernice Fitzmaurice MRCVS have noticed some worrying challenges facing local pet owners. We all know that veterinary care can be expensive, as it is the equivalent of private healthcare for your pets. Unfortunately, there are many factors leading to the increased cost of veterinary services. Like every other sector, the cost of materials and services rises all the time. This has especially hit the world of medicine manufacture after the COVID crisis, leading to higher prices for veterinary medicines, and even complete stoppage of supply in some cases

The cost of wages rises all the time, and this is especially notable this year as the government has raised National Living Wage by 10%, at a time when inflation is now 4.2%.

These costs affect the prices veterinary surgeries need to charge the client in order to stay in business.

In recent years it has also become harder to find qualified vets – although there are new veterinary colleges producing ever-higher numbers of new vets, the rate is not keeping up with the loss from the profession as vets become overwhelmed with the high work load and decide to move away from general practice. Many practices just cannot provide enough appointments and are turning away clients.

A recent survey run by the Riverside team showed that over 50% of pet owners delayed contacting a vet when their pet was sick, because of worries about finding veterinary fees up front. This delay may lead to the animal getting worse, and needing more prolonged or extensive treatment in the long run. Concerns about the welfare of animals led to them coming up with a unique plan.

Riverside Vet Care know that veterinary bills are often unexpected, and even the consultation fee (over £50 in most practices) can be a barrier to getting your pet seen promptly. Riverside are often asked by clients whether they can pay their bill over a period of time rather than upfront, and this has led them to come up with an affordable subscription model which enables clients to pay a small monthly sum in order that their pet can be seen when needed without a consultation fee.

From March 1st, all new clients wishing to register with Riverside will need to enrol at least one pet onto one of their monthly plansthe cost of these varies according to the benefits on each plan, but it is designed so that there is something to suit every budget.

Riverside Vets are the first in the area to offer a plan that is designed to improve access to veterinary care for pets, and hope that by removing the on-the-spot consultation fees that this will encourage clients to seek veterinary advice earlier. Once the pet has been examined by a veterinary professional, treatment options can be discussed and the most appropriate course of action decided upon with the owner.

It will not be compulsory for existing clients to join a plan as long as they visit the surgery at least once a year, for example for their booster vaccinations, or preventative care assessment. However, Riverside's existing PAW Club offers discounts on everything from dispensing fees, consultation fees, blood samples, Xrays and selected long term medications, as well as including all vaccinations and flea/worm control, so Riverside believe it makes good financial sense for many of their longstanding valued clients too.

Helen and Bernice realise that a subscription model may not suit all pet owners, but they feel strongly that quality veterinary care should be accessible to ALL pet owners and feel that this innovation will help people across the Eastern Valleys and Abergavenny area.

Riverside Vets currently has a waiting list for new clients which can be found on their website www.riversidevetcare.co.uk



WAG Club

For £10 a month, clients may have a sick pet seen whenever they need it without paying a consultation fee. This plan also gives 50% off vaccinations. The WAG Club does not include procedures or treatments, but our vets will discuss the different treatment options available and can usually work within your budget to help your pet.



PAW Club

Our popular monthly plan for preventative treatment. For £21 a month, participating pets receive all the vaccinations, flea and worm treatment that they need and may see a veterinary nurse free of charge. This plan also includes discounts on consultation fees, blood samples, X-rays and ultrasound, prescription fees, hospitalisation fees and long term medications.



PAT Club

For £31 a month, this plan combines all the benefits of the WAG and PAW Clubs- it includes all consultations, vaccinations, flea and worm treatments as well as all the discounts listed above. For older animals who need to come more regularly this really makes sense.



Presence, Connection & Support



hen you imagine self care what do you see? An InstaGram carousel of yoga, gym bodies, multistep skin care, sunrise meditations, massages, that new bag, your favourite treat?

How about the less glamorous acts such as meal prepping; automating bills & savings; washing the dishes & laundry; or just taking a nap?

Self care is necessarily both things. It is the frivolous pursuit of joy, and investing in a future self. It is enjoying my Avo Toast while paying into my self employment pension.

As a health & wellbeing practitioner actively investing in my own care, I hear a lot of "I wish I could; I can't afford it; I don't have time.' I can hear it in the voices, the mixture of longing- so closely tied to the feeling that rest and pleasure must be sacrificed for...but also the fatigue- Another thing I Have To Do, which we then feel guilty for skipping. Worse are those who glorify the struggle, the martyrs who just have to do it all alone.

As parents, we are expected to work like we don't have children, and parent as though we don't work. We are all more online than ever, able to watch war and natural disaster in real time. We are accessible 24/7, yet experiencing disconnection and loneliness as symptoms of poor mental health (Mind).

We were never meant to do any of this alone, and placing the burden of care exclusively upon the individual alienates both self and community.

When I lived in Cardiff, I was part of a church who would organise cooking and cleaning rotas for anyone with a new baby, or had just come out of hospital. It could be weeks or month's worth.

Community care was intentional, planned for, and created strong bonds of belonging and friendship.

In my work as a somatic practitioner, I teach clients how to become witness to, and validate their own lived experience; to identify their body's needs and impulses for rejuvenation and

connection. I embody presence, supporting them to uncover their body's sense of release, comfort, and ease. These skills are applicable in daily life. But we don't know what we are not shown. We learn and grow relationally, in community. We evolve reflexively, rubbing up against the world.

We can form intentional networks of care in our faith circles, yoga classes, and online groups like the Abergavenny Bartering Group. Reaching out and admitting our inability to do or be everything, extends the invitation for others to reciprocate. And while the temptation may be to support everyone else, don't forget to let yourself be held, you deserve to be cared for.

ne of the things I'm fond of saying when running workshops, webinars or coaching sessions is that "to experience wellbeing, there is nothing to do, only something to see."

The reason I stress this is that as a culture we've been conditioned to believe that good feelings and peace of mind only come about as a result of *doing* something; that wellbeing is something we have to *add in* to our lives, rather than a kind of factory preset that we find to always be there, whenever we *remove* the obstacles to it, and become fully present to life.

I call this 'Innate Health' because wellbeing is built in to us humans from birth, and it never goes away. This is the "something to see" that puts us back in touch with it.

It may feel like a subtle distinction, but when we're labouring under the false impression that we have to work hard at wellbeing, it's really easy to fail at it, which only makes matters worse!

Sometimes it seems to me like *all* of our behaviours have one underlying, unifying purpose: they're our best attempt, from where we're at in any given moment, to bring ourselves back to the Now; that timeless place of inter-connectedness that feels like home, where the mind is not busy creating a sense of self, for it to then fret about.

Whether it's sport, music, crafts, meditation, deep conversation, cooking, being engrossed in a film or theatre, or a plethora of less healthy pursuits... don't they all have this one thing in common? Aren't they all just pointing us back to a self-less state of presence and oneness?

One activity that really ticks this box is volunteering, whether that's regularly offering your time to a cause, or just performing random acts of kindness for your fellow humans.

Engaging in a pastime that — by definition — serves the needs of others, is a surefire way to remove the biggest obstacle there is to you experiencing wellbeing: the mind's

clamour for attention and servicing of its *own* perceived needs.

When our attention is on others, it is also looking in the direction of a fundamental truth: that we are all one energy, as inseparable from each other as waves are, from the ocean. To rest in this truth, however briefly, is nourishing to the soul, indeed you could almost consider it to be the overarching purpose of our lives.

So lose your self in volunteering, or doing kind things for others. Not for approval or to boost the mind's trivial image of itself, but to reconnect with that literal 'greater good'.

Ironically, the simple act of focusing on the wellbeing of *others*, is the best way to experience it for yourself.

Excavating Llancadle Cemetery

A rare, early medieval burial ground has been unearthed near Cardiff airport that has taken archaeologists by surprise. Helen Morgan from Abergavenny Local History Society reports



he site is believed to date to the 6th or 7th Century with 18 of approximately 80 graves having been excavated so far.

Some of the skeletons buried in an unremarkable field in the grounds of Fonmon Castle are lying on their backs while others are on their sides, while others, some of them women, are buried in a crouching position with their knees tucked up against their chest. Other similar sites have found bodies in crouched positions such as this but considering the number of graves looked at so far, there

seems to be a high proportion. This could be evidence of some sort of burial rite being carried out. As the archaeologists are starting to learn more about this ancient community, they are also finding some unusual features including glass from Bordeaux, North African pottery and a small bone peg that could have been used as a marker in a game or as a tuning peg for a musical instrument. Add to this evidence of butchery and cooking, and a picture emerges that this community indulged in grave-side feasting rituals. "We tend to think of Western Britain as the Celtic Fringe whereas it was fully a part of the wider post-Roman world," says Dr Andy Seaman, lecturer in early medieval archaeology at Cardiff University. "The evidence is that these people had access to high quality imported goods — of a type that can only be obtained through trading or exchange networks with people who themselves had the wealth to bring it here.

Llancadle South II cemetery was discovered in 2022 during fieldwork undertaken as part of the Fonmon Castle Landscape Archaeology Project. Over the past two summers, a team has been busy removing the thin layer of topsoil to expose the graves that were carved into the bedrock some 1,500 years ago. "Early medieval sites are notoriously difficult to identify in Wales and few cemeteries with good preservation of bone have previously been excavated at scale," says Dr Seaman. "The excavation will continue for the next few years, but some interesting results are already emerging."



NOCTURNAL TREASURES

The Brecon Beacons National Park is among only a handful of areas worldwide to be granted the status of an International Dark Sky Reserve.



What do you see when you look up into the night sky? Stars? Darkness? Well, did you know that when you do, you're enjoying some of the best views of stars, constellations and meteor showers in the world? In fact Brecon Beacons National Park has been named an International Dark Sky Reserve, only the fifth destination in the world to be granted such a prestigious status and the first in Wales.

The accreditation has been awarded by the International Dark-Sky Association, based in the USA, and the Brecon Beacons National Park now joins an elite group of areas in Canada, New Zealand, Namibia and the UK's Exmoor National Park recognised as possessing an exceptional or distinguished quality of starry nights and nocturnal environment, specifically protected for scientific, natural, educational, cultural, heritage or public enjoyment.

This news will represent a massive boost for local tourism, as astrotourists, some of whom are already acquainted with the magic of the area, will be drawn here to take advantage of our wonderful glittering skies. Elsewhere in Britain, where night has gradually been lost to light pollution, fewer and fewer people are able to see the details of the night sky. The dark sky reserve in the Brecon **Beacons National Park permits** visitors to come and see what they have lost to light pollution in their own areas.

Sandie Dawe, Chief Executive of VisitBritain said, "Achieving international Dark Sky Reserve status means visitors to Wales can explore the Brecon Beacons with its lush green valleys, hidden waterfalls, fern-filled gorges and spectacular mountain ranges by day, before settling in to experience the magnitude of the Milky Way in pitch black surroundings at night. The announcement is yet another

fantastic reason for guests from around the world to come and enjoy Britain's great outdoors."

The application to gain Dark Sky Reserve status began in 2011 when the Brecon Beacons Park Society and the National Park Authority set up collaboration with the University of Glamorgan, Dark Sky Wales and the Campaign for the Protection of Rural Wales in order to make a bid for the accreditation. The project was made possible thanks to generous funding from the Brecon Beacons Trust, Brecon Beacons National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund and seed funding from the Brecon Beacon's Park Society. Julie James, Chairman of Brecon Beacons National Park Authority paid tribute to "our numerous partners for the hard work they have put in to make the dream of a dark sky reserve real."

Locally raised author, Horatio Clare, who often cites the landscape of the Brecon Beacons as a source of inspiration, described the news aptly and lyrically, saying that, "The stars are mankind's first and last navigation lights. They are nurseries and reserves of myth, poetry, literature and science: that the Brecon Beacons is one of the best places in the world to experience them is wonderful news."

So, next time you gaze up at the night sky, be sure to appreciate the view because it really is one of the very best in the world.
