

# Building a Team of Playworkers for the Whole Town

Playwork is a fun, dynamic approach to facilitating children's play and supporting their individual needs.

Before we talk about the training let's take a look back to set the scene. The Abergavenny Community Trust is the charity which operates Abergavenny Community Centre - it promotes sustainable behaviour, encourages participation and social inclusion, supports families in their various forms and facilitates educational, social, welfare, leisure and recreational activities to enable people to mix.

The Abergavenny Community Centre (occupying the former Infant School above Merthyr Road) is a community space which functions chiefly by bringing people together to do everyday things that keep more of us active and involved in communal life for longer. There's a small part time staff team supported by committed volunteers who come regularly to help at Friday coffee morning, lunches, gardening, toddlers group, dementia friendship cafe, singing, chair yoga, knitting club and monthly Sunday afternoon teas. Running in tandem, the Trust has been growing and developing its 'Supporting Families' work too.

The Centre is known for the offer of meaningful and practical activities which aim to broaden and enrich childhood experiences. Currently, 120 families make up the combined half term, summer holiday, 'hands-on cooking' and community kids' registers - with 102 children (3-16vrs) participating in outdoor learning & play, art club and 'cooking for life' activities last summer. Demand is growing for these activities and while we know families would welcome more - and we would like to offer more - our capacity has limitations and we can't do it alone. The Centre tries to ease this gap by identifying and working with trusted partners, individuals and groups, like the Abergavenny Origami Club who share our values and has the ability to draw on a network of individuals who willingly give time by sharing their craft, in a timeless tradition. Thirty children and family members came along to their Autumn session.

As the saying goes 'it takes a whole village to raise a child' so after publicly testing the desire for building a team of local playworkers as a resource for the whole town, we were committed. Funding can be a stumbling block to getting ideas off the ground but in this case we are pleased to announce that between Abergavenny Town Council, Abergavenny Rotary Club and private donors we have sourced a training provider and the date is set. The Trust is grateful to these generous funders and we are reminded that we live in a spirited, connected place where goodwill can thrive.

Seven Abergavenny walking friends will be joining me doing the 20km route starting and finishing at Llanthony Priory.

Abergavenny Focus has published several articles showcasing some of the amazing rescues the Longtown Team have done. They are a registered charity who rely on donations to cover the £30,000 annual operating costs they have. All team members give up their time voluntarily and receive no payment or expenses. However, it is an expensive operation to run, having the equipment, vehicles and support facilities to potentially save lives.



# Our Plot: a New Community Garden at Peak Cymru



Peak Cymru is an arts organisation based in the Black Mountains. We work from two sites: The OldSchool, Crickhowell and a small reading room on Platform 2 of Abergavenny train station. Through young people's programmes (14-30 years), community collaborations and artist residencies, we explore the unique qualities of our region including the Black Mountains, the Welsh Borders and Vale of Usk.

This year, we're developing a community garden for the former playground and car park of The Old School, Crickhowell. Over the past three months we've been working with a small group of Young People from our previous programmes to develop a set of principles to creatively steer the garden. Young People told us they want the garden to be: 'a place to grow things we love,' an artist's studio,' to not have any clocks' and to be 'allowed to be imperfect'!

This Spring, we launch Play/Ground – a series of creative workshops for 14-18 year olds to experiment with artistic and design practices and to learn green skills. Hosted by artist and designer Sahra Hersi, and working alongside a variety of creative practitioners, designers, farmers and ecologists, the group will meet every month between May and October to imagine and design an element of the community garden. Alongside this, a parallel programme, Our Plot, will host regular sessions for local residents of all ages to join a range of creative and therapeutic activities, working towards an Autumn harvest feast.





# **Bluebells in Bloom**

egend has it that a field or wood full of bluebells is intricately woven with fairy enchantments, with fairies trapping anyone passing by, particularly children. It's unsurprising that a wealth of folklore surrounds these flowers, given that carpets of flowering bluebells are one of the most beautiful events in nature's calendar.

There are two types of bluebell to be found in the UK – native bluebells and Spanish bluebells and April & May are the time to get out and see them. They are a distinctive deep violet-blue flower with a nodding head and petal tips that curl back.

The best places to find bluebells are in ancient woodlands where a rich habitat supports a range of species. Bluebells are important flowers for bees, hoverflies and butterflies, which feed on their nectar.

#### And now to the future and hopefully, the next 20 years...

You may recall I wrote an article a few weeks ago covering the changes within estate agency in terms of additional information now required under the Consumer Protection Act. Parts B and C for Estate Agents. Essentially all sellers are obliged to disclose any material facts relating to the property they are going to sell and agents must carry out as much due diligence as possible. This will take more time at the outset preparing a property to launch to the open market but hopefully, this approach will, hopefully, ensure there are no surprises during the conveyancing process. The more information available at the outset will also provide the seller and agent to speak to the sellers' solicitor about any potential issues that may arise and ensure these are dealt with before a buyer is found.



Although we have introduced some technology over the past 20 years, we are looking to upgrade this significantly to try and avoid duplication and streamline the process. At the moment, we ask our sellers to complete a Property Information Ouestionnaire (paper based) as part of the pre-market process, the sellers subsequently complete lengthy legal property information forms with their solicitor. We also download a Land Registry Title and Plan of the property to be sold and go through any covenants or restrictions and check the boundary plan and to confirm the registered owners. And finally, we ask our sellers to provide their Identification documents so we can comply with HMRC Anti Money Laundering legislation which requires estate agents to confirm the identity of sellers.

We are introducing a system where the seller will complete forms at the outset that are based upon the legal forms, hopefully reducing duplication and providing the sellers' solicitor with completed forms at the early part of the process. The new technology will allow the seller to download and confirm the Land Registry information is correct and also to confirm their identity. There will still be paper based forms and systems for people who would prefer to provide information this way.

This is just one example of technology we are introducing, however, our business is about people and our aim is to make us more efficient 'behind the scenes' to allow us more time to focus on our clients.

We are very proud of our showroom and offices located in the historic Nevill Street opposite St John's Square with some fantastic small businesses as our neighbours. 



# Raisin & Walmut Biscotti

I'm a big lover of freshly ground coffee and these little bites make a perfect accompaniment, plus they are not too high in calories! They only take a few minutes to make although, as they are double baked, a little more patience is required in the baking. A wait that's well worth it!

#### INGREDIENTS

- 175g plain flour
- 1tsp baking powder
- 100g caster sugar
- 1 large egg plus 1 egg white (reserve a teaspoon of egg white for glazing)
- 1/2 tsp vanilla essence
- 60g chopped walnuts
- 40g raisins

- 1. Preheat your oven to 180C/Fan 160C/Gas 4.
- In a large bowl mix together the flour, baking powder and sugar. Then add the chopped walnuts and raisins
- In a separate bowl beat the whole egg, egg white (not forgetting to have reserved a teaspoon for glaze) and the vanilla essence
- Pour into the dry mixture and mix with a wooden spoon, bringing it together with your hands until it all comes together to form a stiff dough.
- 5. On a well floured board roll the mixture into a fat sausage about 25cm long
- Place on a lined baking tray and flatten the dough slightly, you want it to be about 2cm high

- Brush with the teaspoon of reserved egg white and bake in the oven for approx 25-30 mins. The dough should be risen and firm but pale in colour
- 8. Remove from the oven and leave on the baking tray to cool for 10 minutes
- 9. Turn down the oven to 140C/Fan 120C/ Gas 1
- 10. With a bread knife slice the cooled dough into 1cm slices and place back onto the baking tray for approx 25 minutes until lightly browned
- 11. Leave to cool and to crisp up
- 12. Store in an airtight container for up to 2 weeks (if they last that long!)

# Spring Eco Somatics & Storytelling in the Brecon Beacons



Book and from Body & Earth talks to Pridie Tiernan about their forthcoming Eco Somatic and Storytelling Workshop in April, which they will co-host at Cwmffrwd – Pridie's farm – in the Black Mountains, where Pridie also runs foraging and rewilding workshops throughout the year.

Tell me about the farm...

Cwmffrwd is tucked up on the slopes of the Black Mountains. South facing, we gaze across the wide green Rhiangoll Valley, flanked to the east by the range's highest hill, Waun Fach, & Mynydd Troed to the west.

#### What was your vision?

Our vision was always to make nature accessible to all - to use the farm as a base for learning to care for and protect the land. That journey continues today, with us learning just as much from our neighbouring farms and the many incredible people who visit.

Why do you think nature is so important for wellbeing?

Nature activates the brain in a way that wakes it up fully. Body and soul; the same. Nature's narrative is our narrative and something deep inside us instantly recognises this when we step outdoors. With that comes incredible joy and also deep peace.

Where do you go when you need to recharge?

I walk up. Up to a fallen ash tree that sits spearing the sky at the mountain treeline. That ash never fails to provide me with the headspace and heartspace to reset. The workshop will be an opportunity to slow down, and really tune in and attend to our bodies, as more than just vehicles which carry us through the world... and to the world, as more than just a backdrop to our busy lives. We will be connecting to our felt sense of presence and being in the world, as we explore this through embodied practices which take our attention both inward and outward using all of our senses. The invitation is

to get your hands dirty, in the metaphorical and literal sense, as we explore unstructured spontaneous movement, touch, breathwork, art making with found and foraged materials, some shared lunch (provided by us) and some storytelling. I do believe that modern culture both actively and accidentally leads us to neglect, suspect, ignore and deny our bodies' needs and wisdom. It will be a chance to dig a little and hopefully restore confidence in your body and its natural intelligence.

# **Prevention is Better than Cure!** Strengthening your upper back and neck can help prevent rounded shoulders and poor posture

ost of us know that Pilates is proven to help with core strength, balance, and mobility but did you know that it can also help with vour posture? As we age, habits we've picked up from long hours working at a desk, looking at screens and devices, or tending to young children and animals means that we spend much of our lives bent over with our shoulders rounded and our heads in a forward position. Over time this can develop into a 'widows stoop' with the head and chin leading the way and



lots of tension in the upper back, neck and shoulders.

The exercise below is one of my favourites to help strengthen the upper back and shoulders and with practice it can also help

to relieve tension and pain in the upper back. Future proofing our bodies is one of my main goals, so that we can remain healthy and strong in our later years. I teach this exercise regularly in my local classes but you can also learn with me by joining my online community. It's an easy and affordable way to incorporate Pilates into your daily life and your body will thank you for taking the time to look after it. Lying on your front, arms at a 90 degree angle from your shoulder to elbow and elbow to wrist. Forehead and arms resting on the floor. Relax the whole body. Imagine an ice cube under your bellybutton and gently draw your tummy muscles up and away from the ice cube.



Take a breath in and as you exhale, lift your arms and head no more than 1 inch off the mat. Keep looking at the floor rather than lifting your chin. Just make sure you don't squeeze your bottom to help you. The arms and head should feel very heavy as you're using just your upper back and neck to hold this position.



Take another breath in to hold and then as you exhale, draw your elbows towards your ribcage making sure the arms stay no more than 1 inch off the mat. They should just skim the floor. You are holding the weight of the head and arms as before and making sure you switch off the rest of the body.



As you inhale, extend your arms over your head like Superman. Once again, keeping close to the floor. It's important that you don't lift the back up high or strain but keep it small, Less is always more in Pilates. If your shoulders are tight or painful, take your arms to a wider V shape like the next picture.



It doesn't matter how far your arms reach, just keep moving them and bit by bit your mobility will improve with practice and consistency. All the while that little ice cube stays under the belly button and you want to keep your tummy away from it. Your lower body remains relaxed throughout.



Now repeat the sequence 6 times. Drawing the elbows right back towards the ribs as you exhale (pulling the shoulder blades down and away from your ears) and then extending them long over your head as you inhale. It's as if you're dusting the floor while you move the arms back and forth.



But the security system has also wiped everyone's memories of exactly what happened the night before, which means that someone on the island is a murderer - and they don't even know it.









Merthyr Tydfil was at the centre of the Industrial Revolution, but by the 1920s its industrial supremacy had faltered. The area, like much of South Wales, was suffering from widespread unemployment and deprivation. Into this came a Quaker called John Dennithorne, who founded clubs to change the fortunes of unemployed workers. Helen Morgan from Abergavenny Local History Society reports.

n time Cedric Morris, Esther Grainger, Arthur Giardelli and many other artists would come to Dowlais and show unemployed workers how to create art.

Dennithorne trained as an artist at the Central School of Art and Crafts (a forerunner of Central St. Martin's School of Art), in London. He had been working with the finest British sculptors of the age when he heeded the call in 1928 from The Reliaious Society of Friends (Quakers) to help the unemployed. He cared about beauty, including the artistic kind, but Dennithorne had come to think that helping to make life more beautiful for people was a greater necessity. So he moved to Dowlais where he established and became warden of an Unemployed Men's Club in Horse Street. It was so

successful that it had to move into larger premises at Trewern House before extending into adjoining Gwernllwyn house. He remained in Merthyr Tydfil until his death in 1984.

Friends in Britain, as these Ouakers were known, had to prove the value of their contribution to local people. They were conspicuously outsiders from England and relatively privileged. Trades unions wanted volunteers to be paid union rates. Elected representatives sought democratic control while other commentators viewed the schemes as ways of avoiding the recruitment of the unemployed into militancy and communism. By 1932, however, **Dowlais Educational Settlement** was benefiting from grants and was growing into a hub from for classes and courses for Settlement

members. Activities included art appreciation, music, drama and house building as well as mending garments and making re-usable the vast amount of donated secondhand clothing. Dennithorne, meanwhile, was trying to keep the reality of unemployment and the Dowlais situation in the public eye, giving talks, radio broadcasts and interviews for the BBC. "His is the story of adult education in Wales and how art and artists used the medium to change the lives of people in extreme poverty," says Christopher Parry.


