

Bailey Park Bowling Club

Bailey Park Bowling Club is celebrating 100 yrs of bowling in the lovely surroundings of Bailey Park, in the heart of Abergavenny.

The Club was Established on the 15th January 1924 following an advert that was placed in the Abergavenny Chronicle by the Mayor, Councillor J.R.Jacob. At a public meeting it was agreed that a Bowling Club be established and be called Bailey Park Bowling Club with an annual subscription fixed at 2/6 per member.

The bowling green was officially opened on 1st May 1924. The Club has a rich past history of very successful members and in the 60's,70's and 80's Anstey family



represented Wales and appeared on television playing indoor bowls. Lewis Francis represented Wales in the under 18's. More recently in 2022 the Club won the GBL league and came joint top in 2023 losing only on bowls difference.

The council used to care for the green but a few years ago this service was withdrawn and is now the responsibility of the members.

Thanks to Glyn Watkins, Club Chairman and Lewis Francis, Team manager, the green is now looking the best it has looked for sometime and continues to thrive despite many setbacks over the years. Hidden Gems

St Peter's Church, Llanwenarth Citra, Saturday June 8th 10 am - 4:30 pm



his is an Open Churches event to show the church and churchyard as a place of discovery. We are concentrating on the churchyard and the part the church plays in our community life.

St Peter's is situated on Llanwenarth Lane, which used to be the main route to west Wales. The road was later moved to the north of the church, leaving St Peter's in its present peaceful setting.

The churchyard is thus rich in flora and birdlife. A delicate balance is made between preserving this



and allowing access to graves. John Meredith will be available for information on this. The gravestones are a valuable habitat for lichens, which supply food and shelter to a number of invertebrates such as moths.

The gravestones have been researched and mapped by Helena Hunt (see website www.findagrave.com/ cemetery/2542345/st.-peter's-churchyard). Helena has kindly offered to be present to answer any queries.

The gravestones are a fascinating source of stories and history. We have an example of a gravestone made by local stonemason family, the Brutes of Llanbedr (four generations, from 1665 to 1834). It can be seen close to the priest's doorway, and shows the distinctive angel face with the wings turning upwards on each side of plump cheeks.

The lettering is hand carved, and a mistake can be seen where the 'n' in Watkins was missed out. You can just see that it has been inserted above.

The church is open to visitors during the summer months and many write in the visitors' book with their stories and reasons for visiting the church. The entries offer powerful evidence of the glue that holds our communities together.

The church has many interesting treasures including a medieval dole cupboard, which provided for the poor by alms or food (hence the expression 'on the dole'); a Pre-. Raphaelite stained glass window showing an angel carrying a portable organ; and our own newly-restored Vowles organ, which will be played at two short recitals during the day.

There will also be tea and cakes available.



Adventure Safely



A S part of our feature on Outdoors, we invited Jane of Crickhowell Adventure to provide her ex-pert advice on how to enjoy the great outdoors and mountain adventures. Remember, if you're in need of apparel and gear, Crickhowell Adventure is the best place for it. The team will assist with all your needs.

What preparation can we do to do to make our time on the mountains safe and enjoyable?

We need to be adventure smart!

Preparation starts before we've even left the house, ask ourselves some questions: how experi-enced are we for the route decided? Does it take us out of our comfort zone? Is the route known or will it be a new adventure? Do we have the skills for the day? Ground conditions or routes can be tricky, so make sure it's suitable for our experience/ skills. Are we fit enough to manage the up-hills? Even with the route decided, situations can change due to the weather. We know how fickle our weather can be and the difference between the car park and the hill tops are huge. Temperatures can drop and winds can howl, not to mention the rain, did you know we can have rain? Ha ha. Check the weather forecasts to see what is in store and plan accordingly.

Do we have the right gear?

A map is important. There are lots of Apps on phones, but what if the battery goes flat, usually this is at the end of the day, when we're already tired and irritable. Maps are the perfect backup and it's good to see the whole area rather than just a small square on a device. We do need to be able to read a map and have some understanding of navigation. Along with the map, we'll need a compass to take bearings and find North!

No matter what the weather is doing, comfortable walking boots

are necessary. Blisters will ruin a good day's walking, so make sure they fit well. A waterproof jacket is a must have. Even if it's not raining it will keep wind out and keep us warm. Good mid layers will also keep us warm, especially when stopping for a well earned tea break.



We need to take food and drink. On cold days we need something warm to drink to keep us warm and sandwiches taste glorious when eaten on the side of a mountain! When the temperatures are warm and we have sun, expect to drink more water than usual, it's hard work walking up hill! On sunny days, take sunscreen and a hat. It's so easy to burn and not so noticeable if there is a breeze.

We need to remember to keep our dogs on leads to keep livestock and wildlife safe.

June Weather Outlook

Following on from a rather mixed May which provided a fair blend of both rain and drier conditions, unfortunately, for heat lovers, June doesn't look like being a 'flaming' affair. However, we can expect high pressure to be in the vicinity, if not all the time, providing periods of glorious summer sunshine with temperatures that duly match. Receiving life, without effort

"When I argue with reality, I lose – but only 100% of the time."

~ Byron Katie, 'Loving What Is'

n all the years I've been helping people to worry less, and live more, I've concluded that the most difficult notion for us humans to get our heads around is acceptance.

In its endless search for meaning, and its slavish devotion to categorisation and comparison, the mind whirs away endlessly, analysing the circumstances of our lives and coming up with plans for betterment... all the while blissfully unaware that maybe *it's* the problem.

To accept (which comes from the Latin word 'accipere') is "to receive, without effort," which doesn't seem to jibe very well with our experience of life, does it? When was the last time you received — without effort — bad news, criticism, a disappointment, a financial shock?

To the mind, all of these situations are simply wrong, and to *not* react negatively to them seems equally wrong: detached, uncaring, submissive even. If we *do* want to ultimately 'worry less and live more' it looks like what's required is to change or avoid as many of life's pitfalls as possible, so that we can look back and marvel at how skilfully, or luckily, we dodged all the 'bad stuff'. But deep down, you and I both know it doesn't work like that. While we continue to draw breath, we will continue to face challenges, and it's how we deal with them that will last in memory, not their presence or absence.

My daughter recently suffered a minor knee injury – nothing too serious, but we were advised to keep her off all vigorous activity for a full two weeks, at which point we realised, as a family, just how much of this she does! The news was very much *not* received "without effort" and a miasma of sadness settled upon the house.

One evening, just before lights out, in floods of tears, her mind produced a litany of woe: a greatest hits compilation of how unfair it was, how she'd never be able to do any sports ever again, what it was going to be like sitting out at P.E. tomorrow, how she wished she'd never gone on that stupid trampoline in the first place... it was heartbreaking to witness, in addition bringing back my *own* sporting injury disappointments, of which there are many.

In this scenario, it was easy enough for an outside observer to identify the root cause of her suffering: not the knee injury itself — a situation that had happened and was now past — but the mind's response to the injury. Of course there'd be sports again; sitting out at P.E. actually turned out to be ok; and the return to ballet and gymnastics and cycling and performing madcap physical feats around the house were truly joyous events.

Right there and then — *that* present moment; which is the only experience any of us *ever* gets to have — she was snuggled up in bed, overlooked by doting parents, and completely pain free. Life continued – that's what it was giving, but the mind had other ideas, arguing with reality and tormenting her with its time-based tribulations.

How much of our suffering comes about as a result of the mind's *response* to what life offers? All of it? Given that our entire experience of each moment is delivered to us by the infinitely creative power of thought, I think so.

You don't get to choose what happens – life's happenstance is a result of 13.8 billion years of cause and effect and your mind can do diddly squat about that. Neither do you get to choose the thoughts and feelings you experience in a situation – that's a product of the same irrepressible energy force, that happens to include your genetics and your conditioning.

What you *do* get, is an opportunity to wake up from the dream state; to see these self-evident truths playing out in your own life. To realise, for yourself, that the "effort" of non-acceptance stems wholly from your relationship to the mind's complaining, well, that's how real change occurs.

That's when it starts making more and more sense to receive life, *without* effort.



England & Wales -Island Bagging Lisa Drewe £20


Go on an inspirational and fascinating coastline journey – familiar islands are visited, such as Lundy and the Isle of Wight;

Berrington Hall might look dour from the outside but is buzzing with colour indoors. Helen Morgan from Abergavenny Local History Society reports.

his neo-classical mansion near Leominster stands proud in a rolling green landscape, looking westwards towards the Black Mountains. Thomas Harley who built it nearly 250 years ago had long family links with Herefordshire and, by his mid-forties, felt the urge to return to his county of birth as a relief from the hurly-burly of city life. Having commissioned Capability Brown to design the parkland with its 14-acre lake, he also employed Brown's son-in-law, Henry Holland, to design a house in the latest French-influenced Neo-classical style, using the finest craftsmen.

Harley had no male heir, but was delighted when in 1781 his daughter Anne married the son of Admiral Lord Rodney, a great naval commander. She inherited

Berrington in 1804 and the Rodneys continued to live there for the next 95 years. Much of the glittering interior that we see today, however, is not indigenous. The house came to the National Trust relatively bare as the 7th Lord Rodney had gambled away the family wealth and many valuables including several Gainsborough paintings. Instead it is widely furnished and decorated with The Elmar Digby Collection bequeathed to the Trust in 1981, and features fine examples of French furniture, snuff and sewing boxes, seals, clocks and watches, and small objets d'art and de virtue. The ceramic collection is considerable, ranging from a blue and white Chinese plate and carved oriental stand from the 1700s to a 1885 set of Copland bedroom china in a white ground

and gold rope design. The painting collection is small but holds Allan Ramsay's portrait of Jean Jacques Rousseau, and four large sea battle scenes from the War of American Independence. A number of drawings and watercolours are also on display, including a caricature of Winston Churchill as a pirate, and numerous prints, many after Angelica Kauffman featuring historical, mythological and allegorical figures. Last but not least is the court mantua dress from the 1760s that belonged to Anne Harley. It was bought at auction in 2010 in 10 pieces and was missing part of its left sleeve and stomacher. The missing sections were reproduced using digital technology and the entire garment was reconstructed in situ in 2018.


